SAINTS THIS MONTH:

JOHN VIANNEY, PRIEST

Born in 1786, near Lyons in France; he was not quick at study and had great difficulty in being accepted for ordination. He was sent to the parish of Ars, which he transformed by his preaching, his personal mortification, his life of prayer and charity for all, and particularly by his fame as a confessor – people came to him for spiritual help from all over the world. He died in 1859.

ST. LAWRENCE

A deacon of the Church of Rome was martyred four days after Pope Sixtus. He helped administer the funds for the poor. It is said he was burnt to death on a grid iron. After Peter and Paul he is one of the principal patrons of Rome.

ST. CLARE

Clare of Assisi died in 1253, a disciple of Francis, she founded the Poor Clares and was Abbess for 42 years. There is a monastery of Poor Clare Nuns at Baddesley Clinton. It was founded in 1850 from Bruges.

ST. JANE FRANCES DE CHANTAL

Jane died 1641. Married Baron de Chantal and had six sons. Being widowed she founded with her spiritual director, St Frances de Sales, the Visitation sisters.

ST. BARTHOLOMEW

Born in Galilee, one of the twelve apostles. He is probably to be identified with Nathanael, whom Philip called to follow Jesus. Tradition says that he preached the gospel in India and was martyred there.

BLESSED DOMINIC OF THE MOTHER OF GOD

From Viterbo, Italy, he became a Passionist. In 1841 he joined the English Mission and founded four Passionist houses. In 1845 he received the Venerable John Henry Newman into full communion with the Catholic church.
