FROM FR. MICHAEL

The special twofold vocation of this parish is to pray for the souls of all the faithful departed and to proclaim that in the Precious Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ we have all been washed clean of our sins and restored to a right relationship with God our loving Father.

When Jesus celebrated the Last Supper he not only took bread and said 'This is my Body', he also took a cup of wine and said 'This is my Blood'. Not just his Body, but his Blood aswell is offered for the salvation of the world.

For all sorts of historical and practical reasons sharing in the Precious Blood of Our Lord at Mass used to be reserved for the clergy. But this was never the intention of Christ. Christ sheds his blood for us all.

The Second Vatican Council of the 1960's restored the use of the chalice for all Catholics. The Church now encourages all her children, clergy and lay alike to receive the Precious Blood.

It is for this reason that at nearly all our Masses here at All Souls those who are in good standing with the Church are encouraged to receive Holy Communion in both kinds, to receive both the Body of Christ AND the Blood of Christ.

There will probably always be some people who for medical reasons cannot receive from the chalice. But for most of us it is Christ's clear desire that we should share in his Body and his Blood.

'Take this, all of you, and drink from it, this is the cup of my blood...it will be shed for you and for all.'
