**MEETING ABOUT TESCO'S RE-DEVELOPMENT PLAN
IN ST JOSEPH THE WORKER COMMUNITY HALL
17TH OCTOBER AT 7PM.**

This meeting is mainly for Cannon Park residents but the re-development plan involves siting Tesco's petrol station next to our church.

Archbishop Vincent has promised to write to Tesco about the inappropriate siting of their petrol station next to our church. Your parish priest has written to their agents that this planned siting is inappropriate for the following reasons :--

- 1) Noise & the smell of petrol will penetrate into the church. Even with a 12 ft barrier fence it will travel over the top especially when the wind is in the southwest which is the prevailing wind. We need the windows open even in winter,
- 2) De Montfort way will be the main way to the car parking, into the store and into the loading bays and the petrol station. This will mean a big increase in traffic. Access to the church from the shopping centre and vice versa will be difficult and dangerous for pedestrians.
