

When is it?

It's up to you what sort of pilgrim you will be.

- ♦ **Strollers** – take a short walk each evening and slightly longer walks on Saturday and Sunday, starting on Monday 26th March. We'll endeavour to help you get back to your car or bus.
- ♦ **Striders** – walk the complete Coventry Way and Sherbourne Walk in a weekend, starting on the evening of Friday, 30th March. Basic sleeping accommodation will be provided. This is quite a challenge and advance registration is essential.
- ♦ **Saunterers** - walk as much of the route as you like. Take it at your own pace and take as long as you wish. You don't even have to finish by 1st April.

Who is it for?

Everyone, church-goer or not, who wants to participate in a Christian pilgrimage is welcome. If you are in a walking group or a youth group leader why not register a group for the weekend challenge?

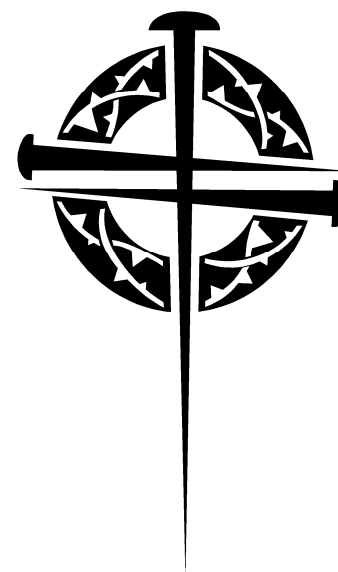

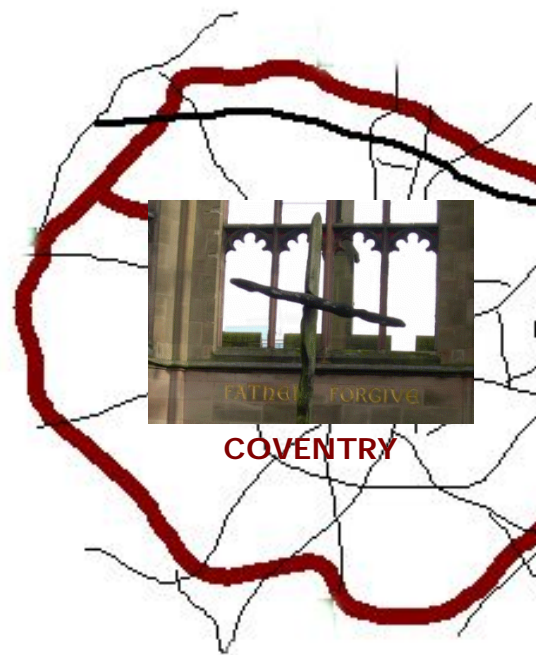

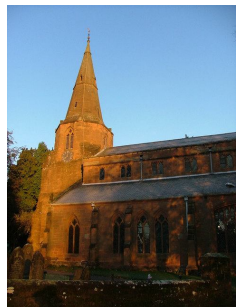
